Beacon South Quarter Improving its Profile

The completion of the Beacon South Quarter area is moving towards its target date of Spring 2014 which is good news for the businesses and residents in the centre. Last year, the National Asset Management Agency (NAMA) agreed to provide a €10 million loan for the construction works which will provide additional residential units and community amenities in addition to making good the currently vacant adjacent blocks pending their future development. The retailers in the Beacon South Quarter have developed a partnership approach to marketing the centre at the same time working on improving the image of the shopping centre resulting in increased footfall so the completion of this development can only be viewed as a positive step.

Local Government Bill, 2013 - Significant Changes to Rates Rebate on Vacant Units

Under current legislation, it is possible for the owners of unoccupied premises to receive a 100% refund of commercial rates on the premises if they are:

- · Undergoing repairs, alterations or renovations
- The landlord is genuinely unable to get a tenant at a reasonable rent
- · Pending redevelopment

However, under the provisions of the new Bill which is currently going through the Dail, it is proposed to reduce the rate of refund by half to only 50%. Were this to be passed into law, it would have obvious implications for already beleaguered businesses and landlords throughout the country who would face a significant increase in taxation liability on properties from which no income is being generated.

Following submissions from the Society of Chartered Surveyors Ireland (SCSI) regarding the inequity of this proposal and strong lobbying for no change to the current policy, Minister Hogan has tabled an amendment recommending that responsibility for deciding on the level of rates refunds should be assumed by the elected members of each local authority.

SBDA will keep members up to date on the progress of the Bill and this specific issue within it.

Two New Incentive Schemes for Businesses in the County

The Enterprise and Economic Development Section of Dun Laoghaire Rathdown County Council is to launch two very positive initiatives for businesses located in the County. Both schemes will apply to the entire Dun Laoghaire borough and therefore include the Sandyford Business District. Businesses will be invited to apply for funding under the two schemes:

- 1. Vacant Commercial Premises Incentive Scheme
- 2. Shop Front Improvement Scheme.

The key points of the schemes are:

- They are currently only proposals and will be voted on by Councillors on 10th March.
- The proposed budget for the Vacant Premises Scheme is €100,000 and applies to retail and office premises.
- The Vacant Premises Scheme will apply only to properties with a rateable valuation of less than €40,000.
- The proposed budget for the Shop Front Improvement Scheme is €50,000.
- Both schemes will be on a 'first come, first served' basis until the budget(s) run out.

SBDA will keep members up to date on both these new incentive schemes.

NEW ROAD OPEN! Burton Hall Road Extension Completed

As a result of continuous liaison between SBDA and DLRCoCo, the extension to Burton Hall Road, from its junction with Blackthorn Avenue through to Leopardstown Road, opened in January 2014. This new entrance and exit from Sandyford onto the Leopardstown Road alleviates traffic congestion particularly during peak times reducing travel times for commuters. Reports received by the SBDA confirm that traffic in the area has improved since the opening.



New Cycle Routes Launched for Sandyford

As part of the Sandyford Smarter Travel initiative Dún Laoghaire - Rathdown County Council have launched a Sandyford Cycle Route brochure which is available to download from: www.sandyfordsmartertravel.ie/travel-options/cycling.

The website also now contains a calorie counter that estimates the number of calories you can burn while walking (see bottom of home page). Cycling is a really great way to get in and out of Sandyford and there are numerous cycle lanes all around the area. Cycle parking is available at Luas stops and throughout the business district. Cycling provides a fast and efficient journey at very low cost, it's pollution free, good fun, and there's no additional cost for every journey made. The average cyclist can cover up to 12 miles an hour by bike. To plan your route the average journey times for the Sandyford Business District have been mapped.

New Junction for Leopardstown Roundabout Approved

The Leopardstown Roundabout and Link Road has been approved for development by An Bord Pleanála and works are due to commence in June 2014. Employees in the South County Business Park will notice some tree felling and other accommodation works being carried out within the area in advance of construction.

The SBDA has been assured that during the construction works and effective construction management plan and traffic management plan will be implemented by the contractor and supervised by Dun Laoghaire Rathdown County Council during each phase of the road development to ensure that the impact of the construction on people working and visiting the area will be minimised. The new scheme will see the replacement of the existing roundabout with a signalised crossroads with the aim of improving traffic flow into and out of the district.

The scheme consists of the following elements:

- a) The upgrade of the existing Leopardstown Road/Brewery Road Roundabout into a 4-arm signal controlled junction;
- b) The amalgamation of the existing entrances to Leopardstown Racecourse, South County Business Park



and Leopardstown Park Hospital, via the new Leopardstown Link Road, into a single new signalised junction further east along Leopardstown Road;

- Retention of part of the existing South County Business Park access road as an exit only onto Leopardstown Road (west);
- d) The construction of high quality pedestrian and cycle facilities on all affected roads:
- e) The provision of a public park around the drainage attenuation pond as a landscape feature;
- f) Landscaping and boundary treatment along the length of the scheme where existing boundaries are affected;
- g) Traffic cameras at the two principal junctions (Brewery Road/Leopardstown Road and Leopardstown Road/ New Link Road) to allow active monitoring of traffic at these locations.

Interim Solution to Traffic Congestion at South County Business Park

Dun Laoghaire Rathdown County Council has commenced works on the Leopardstown roundabout to facilitate a "fast left turn only" exit lane from South County Business Park. This has resulted from extensive lobbying by the Sandyford Business District Association (SBDA) and companies in South County Business Park.

Recently, traffic congestion in the Park has been unacceptable with long delays being reported. It is hoped that other measures, such as the recent opening of the Burton Hall Road Extension and the planned reconfiguration of the Leopardstown Roundabout, will provide a permanent solution to traffic congestion in the area.
